

Advent Sermon Series

Expecting Christ in Numbers

Advent is a special season of the year as we prepare our hearts for Christmas. The birth of Christ marks the time of year when God's great saving purpose reaches a decisive climax. The coming of Christ brings hope, love, joy, and peace to the world. We mark these realities with the lighting of the Advent wreath leading up to Christmas Eve when we light the Christ candle. This evening service of communion and candlelight is one of our most special times. This year, we will gather all together for a single service on Christmas Sunday morning to worship and bear witness that Jesus Christ, the Savior of all who believe, has come!

On Sunday mornings during Advent, we will discover the life of Christ prefigured for us in the book of Numbers. Jesus taught His disciples that the Scriptures find ultimate fulfillment in Him (Luke 24:25-27). He is their Author and central Subject. The book of Numbers reveals the hope, love, joy, and peace that we find in Christ. We will find hope, as our Savior's birth is heralded in the wilderness by John the Baptist, who was a Nazirite from birth. We will discover love, as Jesus is faithful in wilderness temptations on our behalf. We will know joy, as Jesus is lifted up on the cross 'for the joy set before Him,' just as the bronze serpent was lifted up in the wilderness. We receive good news of peace when the star rising in the east, which was prophesied by Balaam, actually appears over Bethlehem. I warmly invite you and your family to share this Advent season together with us at Kenwood.



In January, we will turn our attention to a series on biblical leadership in the church. The Christian vision of leadership stands in stark contrast to many of the cultural or corporate paradigms around us. Biblical leaders are recognized not by their

status, gifts, or influence, but by the godliness of their character. "For the LORD sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the a scepter shall rise LORD looks on the heart" (1 Sam 16:7). Biblical leaders are called to exercise shared leadership as a group, with humility and dedicated service. In the New Testament, we see this most often as a consecrated group of elders. Elders are appointed in every church throughout Paul's missionary journeys (Acts 14:23). Near the end of his ministry, Paul instructs Titus to appoint godly elders to lead the church (Tit 1:5-9). Elders are to be people who know the Word of God, pay close attention to their own lives, and "care for the church of God, which He obtained with Hzis own blood" (Acts 20:28). We will seek to understand and apply this series to our life together at Kenwood. May the Lord continue to fill us with wisdom and discernment. May He raise up additional godly leaders among us. May we continue to flourish in faith and follow Him wholeheartedly in the upcoming New Year.
